Teach that 'ck' together stands for the same sound as 'c' and 'k' separately – ck never comes at the beginning of a word, but often comes at the end or near the end.

When the letters **l**, **s** and **f** double at the ends of some words and **c** is joined by **k**, it is a good idea to draw a line underneath both letters to show that they represent one phoneme (e.g. **hill**, **pick**) when providing words and captions for reading, and encourage children to do so in their writing.

Letters and Sounds Games

Here is a list of games that you could play with your child to help them progress through phase two of Letters and Sounds.

1. s-a-t-p-i-n words.

Using only the letters s,a,t,p,i,n how many words can you make?
Challenge: Add a letter in each time, according to the order of the flash cards above and challenge yourself to think of new words.

2. Words that begin with...

Select a sound and then list verbally the words that begin with each sound. E.g. S-sit, song, sad, seen etc.

3. Right from Wrong

Write two or three words of which some are the correct spelling and some are not. Choose the correct spelling. E.g. wos woz was. Children should circle or write the correct spelling. You can add more words to make this more challenging.

4. Rhyme it!

This game tunes into the sounds in a word. Write or list as many words as you can that rhyme e.g. with neat (meat, heat, feet, Pete, Crete, cheat, bleat, treat). What are the meanings of each word?
